WELCOME

Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597 AD.

WORSHIP

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer (Matins) and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong with music from the Cathedral Choir or one of the many excellent visiting choirs who come to sing during the Cathedral Choir's holidays (said service with organ music and hymns on Thursdays). The Cathedral's principal act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.

Visiting Choir

The choir of St John's, Barham consists of local people of all ages who love to sing traditional English church music. They sing regular Eucharists and occasional Evensongs and are currently preparing a full programme of music for Lent, Passiontide and Easter.

The University of Kent Cecilian Choir is a by-invitation choir comprising staff, students and alumni. Repertoire ranges from Hassler to Hepplewhite, with a particular emphasis on contemporary works. As well as performing sacred music, the choir takes part in staged works, including Dido and Aeneas and Alice in Wonderland.

Voices of St John and All Saints is comprised of musicians from the University of Cambridge and the Tudeley Singers, and was formed for this Ash Wednesday service. The Tudeley Singers have sung in Canterbury and many other cathedrals as well as giving concerts in Kent. The Cambridge members come from several college chapels, including Queens', Pembroke and St John's.

Canterbury Christ Church University Chamber Choir performs choral music of all periods and styles to the highest standard, performing in several concerts on campus during the academic year, as well as the graduation ceremonies in the Cathedral, the annual Spring Concert, and the Carols by Candlelight in the Cathedral.

The Damian Singers, named after the 1st century Saint (St Damian and usually paired with his brother St Cosmos), is a mixed voice adult choir. Singers come from all over the country and are brought together solely for the purpose of providing music within the liturgy as a Visiting Choir. The Singers last visited Canterbury Cathedral in 2015 and are delighted to return.
