WELCOME

Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597 AD.

WORSHIP

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer (Matins) and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong with music from the Cathedral Choir or one of the many excellent visiting choirs who come to sing during the Cathedral Choir's holidays, or a service of said Evening Prayer in the Crypt. The Cathedral's principal act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.

Visiting Choirs

The Epiphoni Consort is an award-winning chamber choir based in and around London. Its flexible membership comprises singers trained to a professional level but pursuing other full-time careers. The group has rapidly developed a reputation for creative programming and accomplished, nuanced performances, appearing by turns as a chamber choir, symphonic chorus, or solo voice ensemble, performing 12-15 concerts and other engagements a year.

Holy Spirit Choir from Lake Forest, Illinois offers a vibrant music program that touches parishioners of all ages through its choirs during worship on Sunday mornings and at other special services and musical events throughout the year. The choir sings each Sunday from September to June, at special services throughout the year, and offers Choral Evensong on a regular basis.

The Compline Choir from St Mark's Cathedral, Seattle was founded in 1956, and is a unique community of laypersons with diverse beliefs that seeks to express musically a concern for the nurture and care of the soul - spiritual nourishment. All members of choir are volunteers and freely give of their time and talents. Dr Jason Anderson has directed the choir since 2009.

Sine Nomine Choir Rugby was founded in 2001 to sing sacred repertoire to a high standard in cathedrals and churches. The Choir supports many local charities throughout Warwickshire, giving concerts with a variety of sacred and secular music, and has sung in many cathedrals including St Paul's, Winchester, Worcester, Durham and York Minster, and St George's Chapel Windsor and Westminster Abbey. The Choir is looking forward to its fifth visit to Canterbury Cathedral to sing the services.

RSCM Voices South is an adult training choir, which sings in cathedrals and major churches across the South of England. Learning new repertoire and developing vocal and musical skills is at the heart of the choir's work, so the choir sings music of a wide range of styles and periods which present different challenges and teaching points.

The choir of **St Paul's, Canterbury** takes a leading role in the weekly Sunday morning worship, as well as the popular monthly Evensong and Supper services, and other seasonal events. The choir has featured as a visiting choir at several cathedrals, primarily around South East England, and at Ypres as part of the daily service held under the Menin Gate.

Vox Cantabilis is a chamber choir from Bischofshofen in Salzburg, Austria. It was founded in 1990 by Andreas Gassner, who is also the Director of Church Music for the Archdiocese of Salzburg. Vox Cantabilis has a varied repertoire ranging from the 17th to the 21st century, with a special focus on a cappella music. Andreas Gassner has adapted the tradition of choral evensong for the German-speaking context and Vox Cantabilis regularly sings evensongs in German.

The Exonian Choir is a London-based vocal ensemble of former choral scholars from Exeter College Chapel Choir, University of Oxford and beyond. Founded in 2016, the Choir members meet several times a year to perform the music they learned and loved as choral scholars, in both concert and sacred settings. Over the last few years, the Choir has sung choral evensong at Westminster Abbey, St Paul's Cathedral, Southwark Cathedral, and Westminster Cathedral.
